Local troop sponsors (churches, schools) are only responsible for providing a meeting place. Legally, the troop sponsors are considered to operate the troops. Sponsor organizations can, and have, been named in lawsuits relating to scout troop activities.

Boy Scout troops can't incorporate or establish their own 501(c)(3) tax-exempt status. Many troops have incorporated and obtained their own IRS tax-exempt status. Incorporation helps protect the assets of the troop, the volunteers, and the sponsor.
